We have two vacancies for International Clinical Fellowship (Trust Doctor, Specialist Registrar level) posts in the Paediatric Host Defence Unit based at the Great North Children's Hospital (GNCH). These posts will incorporate responsibility in Paediatric Bone Marrow Transplantation as well as providing excellent experience in aspects of Paediatric Haematology / Oncology and / or Paediatric Immunology / Infectious Diseases.

There are 2 posts available; one each from 1 September 2011 (or as soon as possible, Closing date: 28th August 2011 at midnight) and 1 March 2012, for periods of 6 - 12 months. The posts provide excellent experience in all aspects of paediatric bone marrow transplantation.
